Guru Nanak said this and Mohammed, thus the Lord takes form,

Ādi Guru Dattātreya. jag. meñ, Mā, Jesus keh.lati ho

Primordial master Dattatreya came on this Earth, O Mā, Jesus spoke of it

He jag. bhar.tā pālan. kar.tā yo, aur char.tā dīnā-nāth,

O, Support of this Universe, Giver of nourishment, and Protector of the poor on this Earth

Ātma-gñyān. kā bodh. karā ham, Guru swayam kā bana diyā

You give us the Guru state, the essence of life and establishing as one's own Guru

Born among people Shri Gaurī came, Shri Pārvatī was in this life

Saviour of the World, in the form of Guru, as Shri Krishna (Rescuer of the Earth) is Your Advent
